The Antinori family has been producing wine in Tuscany for six centuries and exporting it for four – that’s 26 generations of uninterrupted family ownership, making them the 10th oldest company in the world that is still in the hands of the same family.

The family moved to Florence in the early 13th century, and to this day, remain central figures in the fabric of the city.

Piazza Antinori is the square in the historic centre where **Marchese Piero Antinori** still lives. The purchase of the **Tignanello** estate in 1850 marked the beginning of a remarkable period of expansion, which shows no signs of abating. Through judicious acquisition of vineyards, and an uncanny knack for developing iconic wines, Antinori has become Tuscany’s – arguably Italy’s – preeminent wine producer, establishing an important presence in Piedmont, Umbria, Puglia and Lombardy. Marchese Piero Antinori sums up the company’s outlook thus: “Ancient roots play an important role in our philosophy, but they have never held back our spirit of innovation.” Today the president of the company is **Albiera Antinori** (Piero’s eldest daughter), while the Marchese retains the title of honorary president. **Renzo Cotarella**, creator of **Cervaro della Sala**, is the CEO and chief winemaker.

TIMELINE

1385	Giovanni di Piero Antinori joins the Winemakers Guild of Florence.
1750s	The family begins to market its wine abroad, particularly in the United Kingdom , thereby gaining greater prestige.
1850	The Antinori family adds to the family holdings a series of small farms with vineyards in the Chianti Classico area, including 47 hectares at Tignanello .
1863	Piero Antinori , together with his brother, founds what is to become the present-day company of Marchesi Antinori.
1932	Carlotta della Gherardesca weds Niccolò Antinori, bringing as a dowry the land and the buildings which will eventually be given the name of Tenuta Guado al Tasso , in the splendid area of Bolgheri.
1938	Piero Antinori , son of Niccolò Antinori and Carlotta della Gherardesca, is born at Villa Antinori. He becomes company president in 1966.
1940	Purchase of Castello della Sala in Umbria to make white wines. At the time the estate includes 52 hectares of olive groves and vineyards. Renovation work at the 15th century castle is undertaken.
1961	Niccolò Antinori engages oenologist Giacomo Tachis . He will become a legend in modern Italian winemaking, giving his contribution to many iconic wines.
1970	First vintage of Tignanello , a turning point in the oenology of Chianti, followed in 1978 by the first vintage of Solaia , a “cru” contiguous to the Tignanello vineyard.
1979	Renzo Cotarella arrives to direct the Castello della Sala and, in less than ten years, creates the wines that now symbolise the estate.
1987	The family acquires 325 hectares of land around the Badia di Passignano abbey in Chianti Classico, situated in an area famous for its wine production for approximately one thousand years.
1989	Start of the Prunotto project in Piedmont.
1997	Solaia is the world’s number one wine according to the Wine Spectator. The 1997 Solaia is the first Italian wine to head the list of the world’s finest wines selected annually by this influential magazine.
1999	Start of the Tormaresca project in Puglia.
2011	Matarocchio’s first vintage (2007), produced at the Guado al Tasso estate, is released. The maximum expression of a single grape variety (Cabernet Franc) and a single vineyard parcel.
2012	Inauguration of Bargino , Antinori’s spectacular new cellar in Chianti Classico. For the very first time, Antinori open the door to visitors.

NORTHERN ITALY

PRUNOTTO, PIEDMONT

Alfredo Prunotto founded his business in 1922, and was one of Piemonte’s most dynamic exporters until his retirement in 1956. The company passed then to Prunotto’s friend Beppe Colla, now a revered winemaker and one of the founding fathers of modern Piemonte. His defining moment was the decision in 1961 to bottle single-vineyard, or “cru”, wines from the finest sites – a practice that is now the norm in the region. Those wines were made from bought-in grapes, but in the 1990s the current owners, the Antinoris of Tuscany, extended the Prunotto holdings, including plots in the outstanding Bric Turot and Bussia vineyards. The range of crus was augmented two decades later by Barolo Cerretta and Barbaresco Secondine. Since 2014 there has been a stylistic change and a further uplift in quality: Prunotto now makes some of the purest and most aromatic Nebbiolos in the region, as well as satisfyingly concentrated and deftly balanced Barberas.

JERMANN, FRIULI

In the eighteenth century, the Jermann family migrated over 200 miles from Austria’s Burgenland to Biljana in Slovenia, tantalisingly close to their eventual home in Friuli. In 1881, Anton Jermann completed the final seven-mile leg of the journey to Farra d’Isonzo, where the historic family winery can be found. While the family brought a strong winemaking tradition with them, it was the vision of Anton’s great-grandson Silvio that turned the Jermann name into a reference point not only for the region, but also for Italy as a whole. The release of Vintage Tunina, a pioneering blend of international and local varieties, sparked the revolution in 1975, but the arrival of Dreams Chardonnay in the mid-eighties, followed by Capo Martino in the early nineties, saw Jermann transcend from visionary to icon. With over 30 Tre Bicchieri awards from the Gambero Rosso guide, Jermann is rightly recognised as one of Italy’s finest producers. Jermann own a combined 170 hectares of prime vineyards at their two estates in Collio and Isonzo, and having been early advocates for sustainable agriculture, are well placed to continue their pioneering viticultural journey long into the future.

MARCHESE ANTINORI TENUTA MONTENISA, LOMBARDY

The Montenisa Estate, located in the village of Calino in the heart of the Franciacorta appellation, was purchased in 1999 by the Antinori family to give them a foothold in Italy’s leading region for high-quality sparkling wine. Since then Antinori have applied their usual high standards, combining rigorous vineyard management, partial barrel fermentation, and extended ageing on the lees, in order to craft a range of world-class traditional method sparkling wines.

CENTRAL ITALY

ANTINORI, TUSCANY

The Antinori family have been producing wine in Tuscany for over six centuries, and exporting it for four, spanning twenty-seven generations of uninterrupted family ownership ... and counting. The first recorded mention of the family dates from 1180, when they worked in the silk trade. Winemaking was added to the family's activities in 1385, and during the sixteenth century the wines spread, along with Antinori's reputation, to France, Flanders, Spain and North Africa. The purchase of the Tignanello estate in the mid-1800s marked the beginning of a remarkable period of expansion, and since then, through judicious acquisition of vineyards and an uncanny knack for developing iconic wines, Antinori has become Tuscany's – arguably Italy's – pre-eminent wine producer. Some of the wines – Badia a Passignano, Pèppoli, Tignanello and Solaia – are each the product of a single estate, while Villa Antinori and the Vin Santo are blends of selected lots from several of the family's vineyards, including the flagship Tenuta Tignanello site.

LA BRACCESCA, TUSCANY

With its warmer climate and local variant of Sangiovese – Prugnolo –Vino Nobile offers a richer, headier experience than Chianti to the north. The wines have been made for at least 1,200 years; Antinori joined the party in typically impressive style in 1990. The La Braccasca estate straddles Vino Nobile and the neighbouring appellation, Cortona, which is proving Italy’s most successful appellation for Syrah.

LE MORTELLE, TUSCANY

Located in the Maremma, Tuscany’s rising star of a region, the eye-wateringly beautiful Le Mortelle estate has belonged to the Antinori family since 1999. It is named after the wild myrrh – mortella – found in this part of the Tuscan coast, and indeed the fostering of local flora and fauna is a central aim of the estate, which includes fifteen hectares of organic orchards in addition to the vineyards. Cabernet Franc has found a home from home in the warm, sea-breeze-tempered climate, bringing wonderful aroma and freshness to the red wine. For the white, classic coastal variety Vermentino is joined by Viognier and Ansonica (the same as Sicily’s Inzolia), which is making a serious name for itself in the Maremma.

PIAN DELLE VIGNE, TUSCANY

Brunello is the driest zone of Tuscany, and has a winning combination of warm days and cool nights, allowing Sangiovese to reach optimum ripeness while retaining acidity and maximising concentration. The result is one of Italy’s grandest appellations, in which Antinori bought this well-sited estate in 1995.

SANTA CRISTINA,
TUSCANY & UMBRIA

The Antinori family released their first wine under the Santa Cristina name in 1946. Since then Santa Cristina has been a byword for quality and value in Tuscany – now more so than ever since the creation of a dedicated winery in 2006. The range now consists of reds and a rosé from Tuscany and whites from Umbria, so the winery’s location in Cortona, southern Tuscany, is ideal.

TENUTA GUADO AL TASSO, TUSCANY

Situated in Maremma on the Tuscan coast, sixty miles southwest of Florence, the Guado al Tasso estate extends from the green hills surrounding the old village of Bolgheri down to the sea. This beautiful plain is called the ‘anfiteatro Bolgherese’ due to the fact that the hills enclose the plains overlooking the sea to form a natural amphitheatre. The Bolgheri DOC started out as rosé-only; whites were permitted in 1984, and ten years later the laws finally recognized the extraordinary success of the mould-breaking Cabernet-based reds. From the 2007 vintage, Cabernet Franc has entered the picture, both as an exceptional blending component for Guado al Tasso, and also as a limited-edition single-variety bottling called Matarocchio.

CASTELLO DELLA SALA, UMBRIA

Niccolò Antinori bought the fourteenth-century Castello della Sala in 1940, to provide a source of white wines to match the excellence of his Tuscan reds. With the introduction of Cervaro della Sala in 1987, his dream was fully realized: this is one of Italy’s defining whites, as influential and sought-after as Tignanello. Bramito is effectively a mini-Cervaro, further proof of Umbria’s affinity with Chardonnay; Conte della Vipera is a full, herbal, bordeaux-inspired blend of Sauvignon and Semillon. The inhabitants of the castle originally ruled over the whole province of Orvieto, so the range would not be complete without a flagship example of that DOC; the ‘Superiore’ designates much lower permitted yields, and hence considerable concentration.

SOUTHERN ITALY

TORMARESCA, PUGLIA

In the mid-1990s Piero Antinori travelled to Puglia with Renzo Cotarella on an exploratory trip that he says opened their eyes to the area’s potential. “It was immediately clear to us that though this region had a proud history and ancient grapes that dated back to the days of the Magna Graecia; it had yet to blossom fully in oenological terms.” Together, they took the reins of the Tormaresca estate in 2009, championing indigenous grape varieties from the Salento and Primitivo di Manduria DOC area in a new dawn of quality, Puglian wine. The estate works with Fiano Pugliese, Negroamaro, Primitivo and Aglianico – Masseria Maime is regularly one of Puglia’s best. The Chardonnay-ripe Pietrabilanca has been monikered the ‘Cervaro of the south’. Vineyards are planted unusually densely, giving extra depth to wines that are otherwise fresh, vibrant and elegant thanks to the abundant sunshine and wave-kissed terroir.

TENUTA BOCCA DI LUPO, PUGLIA

The Bocca di Lupo estate is located in the northern Puglian countryside of Minervino Murge, in the DOC region of Castel del Monte, an area well known for its wild beauty. The vines grow at about 300 meters above sea level in the Murgia, an area with challenging climatic conditions and soils low in nutrients, meaning patient hard work is required to produce wines that are elegant, lively, and with well-defined precision. Certified organic winemaking is not simply a final objective, but rather, an opportunity. Local varietals like Aglianico, Nero di Troia and Fiano Pugliese represent the heart of the Castel del Monte agronomic history. Here, they are worked to an unrivalled finesse since Antinori’s first investment in the region in the late 1990s.

STAG'S LEAP WINE CELLARS

Stag's Leap is one of the undisputed icons of the Napa Valley. The winery was founded in 1970, and their 1973 Cabernet won the famous Judgement of Paris tasting, beating first- and second-growth bordeaux. Since then they have become one of the most lauded and sought-after wine producers anywhere in the world. The winery is located in the Stags Leap District, a small sub-division in the south-eastern Napa Valley known for producing particularly elegant, ageworthy wine. Over the last five decades, Stag's Leap Wine Cellars have witnessed the dizzying proliferation of Napa Valley vineyards, yet amidst all their new neighbours have retained their own, compelling voice.

CHILE

HARAS DE PIRQUE

The magnificent Haras de Pirque estate occupies a privileged position at the foot of the Andes, in Chile’s Maipo Valley region. The lovingly tended vineyards are on largely north-facing slopes, from the middle of which rises a unique horseshoe-shaped gravity-flow winery, inspired by the estate’s other claim to fame: as a former internationally-renowned thoroughbred breeding farm. The wine side of Haras de Pirque is now owned by Italy’s Antinori family, their chief winemaker Renzo Cotarella bringing his own elegant sensibility to bear while respecting the character of this very particular terroir.

GREAT ESTATE GRAPPAS

It stands to reason that the greatest wine estates should be able to provide the raw materials for some exceptional grappa. The Tignanello is bottled clear and unaged, while the Sassicaia is aged for five years in barrel (Sassicaia barrels, no less) after distillation by none other than...Jacopo Poli. Two splendid grappas are made from the pomace of San Leonardo, one of Italy’s greatest Bordeaux blends. Crafted by master distiller Bruno Franceschini in steam-heated pot stills, the Grappa Bianca is bottled unaged, while the Grappa Stravecchia spends five years in French oak that previously held the San Leonardo wine. Both are presented in elegant decanters.

BRANDY

Produced only 5 times in the last 50 years and in very limited quantities, Antinori Brandy is closely linked to the winemaking reality of Marchesi Antinori, being a pure distillate of wine. It is aged in small oak barrels for over 6 years, which gives Antinori Brandy an intense and distinct personality, balanced by an excellent smoothness and exceptional persistence.
